Worksheet: Files and Folders



Level: Middle School, 2nd Grade

Lesson: Informatics, Files and Folders

Lesson Aims:

- To recognize the basic storage units which we find in our Graphic Environment
- To understand what a file is and what content a file may contain
- To recognize different file types from their icons and extensions
- To be able to find the basic characteristics of a file (i.e. name, extension, size, date)
- To compare files based on their basic characteristics
- To select folder views.

Activities

- 1. Activate (*single click*) the **Windows Explorer** from the **Taskbar**.
- 2. Select (*single click*) from the left pane **Computer** to see the basic storage unit(s) (in our case is just one unit). What is the name of this unit and what information we have about its capacity?

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 Select from the left pane Libraries and then Documents. Open (*double click on the icon*) the Folder Collection of Files and Folders. Describe the characteristic icon which represents a Folder:

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- 4. Open Folder File Samples and then open each file inside this folder. A file opens automatically with a specific application. *Pay attention to this association, because you have to fill in a table in activity 9*. Can you figure out if this association depends on:
 - a. the file name
 - b. the file Icon
 - c. the place of the file inside the folder
 - d.
- The file name contains a short extension which may not be always visible. In order to reveal the extensions of the files, select from the Windows Explorer menu Organize > Folder and Search Options > View. Uncheck the Hide extensions for known file types checkbox.
- 6. Try to rename (right click on the file icon and select **Rename**) the file **Hamlet.txt** to **Hamlet.abc**. Write down what happened after this change.

- 7. Is it safe to change the file extension for a file and why?
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- 8. Perhaps you should revise your answer in activity 4. Why?
