From Spanish, to Austrian to French rule

After Waterloo: united with the Netherlands BUT:

The Netherlands: Dutch liberal & protestants Brussels & Belgian elite: French liberals & catholics Flanders: Flemish speaking catholics

1830: the Belgian revolution a French liberal elite in Brussels started, Flemish & French catholics compromised. England, France and Prussia were happy to limit the power of the Netherlands...

educational principles in Belgium Freedom of education

as a result of liberal-catholic compromise, a freedom of education was embedded in the constitution


- Every natural or legal person:
- has the right to organize education
- establish institutions for its purpose

= parental freedom of choice

important: a freedom of religion & language this became a political battlefield for the next century (!)

3 Learning outcomes

trust in the independence of the school & teacher

There are no central examinations in Flanders: the teachers, as a team, will decide independent whether or not a student qualifies for the learning outcomes.

The learning outcomes are provided by the Flemish government.

Every school network will translate those outcomes in a curriculum. But even within the curriculum, the teachers decide how to imply it.

A centralized team of inspectors will guard the learning outcomes by visiting schools and teachers.

It's free!

While secondary schools can charge for extra costs like books and excursions, primary schools stay completely free.

Private schools that are also private funded (with a high cost for the parents) exists but are an exception.

4 Compulsory education

* first law on compulsory education in 789 by Charlemagne

Start:

September 1 of the calendar year the child reaches the age of 6

End:

June 30 of the calendar year the child reaches the age of 18

Full-time compulsory education until 15

Again, the principle of freedom: compulsory educations is not the same as compulsory school attendance! e.g. homeschooling or private teaching is still possible!

Holidays!

1 week at the end of October (All Saints) 2 weeks around Christmas 1 week for Carnival (incl. ash wednesday) 2 weeks around Easter

Summer: 2 months!

Normal weekday 8.30am-16.35pm Free on Wednesday afternoon

nursery education (2,5-6 years) without obligations

primary education (6-12 years)

Subject areas:

- reading & writing, Dutch language

- mathematics

- physical education
- global orientation (people and society + science and engineering/ technology)
- musical education
- -French

Secondary education:

(12-18 years)

ASO - General Secondary Education: A very broad, general education, preparing for higher education.

TSO - Technical Secondary Education focus more on technical aspects and/ or practical matters.

BSO - Very practical and very jobspecific education. Afterwards, several directions offer specialisation years.


Art Secondary Education: These schools link general and broad secondary education development with active art practice
